1. Welcome & Apologies

- The meeting was called to order by Mark Polina.
- Attendees were welcomed.
- Final opportunity to present proxy votes was given.
- Apologies received: Richard, Cheryl Penn. These were formally recorded.

2. Adoption of Agenda

- The agenda had been circulated prior to the meeting.
- No additional matters were raised.
- The agenda was adopted as presented.

3. Ratification of Previous Minutes

4. President's Report - Mark Polina

- Mark reflected on his 4.5 years as President, highlighting challenges such as:
 - COVID-19 (2020), lockdowns & unrest (2021), floods (2022), and ongoing financial instability.
- Shared optimism due to:
 - o Increased member engagement
 - New funding sources

- Strong exhibition programming
- Expressed gratitude to:
 - Angela Shaw (Executive Director), Council and fundraising teams (especially Paul), Exhibition Committee (notably Rachel), artists, staff, and volunteers.
- Emphasised:
 - o Continued member ownership and engagement
 - Staff sacrifices and commitment
 - o Visionary, inclusive leadership
- Reaffirmed KZNSA as a community hub for Glenwood and Durban.

5. Executive Director's Report - Angela Shaw

- Thanked core team and council members.
- Acknowledged a slow start to the year and post-COVID disconnection.
- Expressed excitement about new council nominees.
- Shared highlights from her Master's research on KZNSA's sustainability in the nonprofit sector.
- Emphasised the importance of members as the ecosystem's core.
- Announced:
 - A members' meeting on Sunday, 27th for collaborative exhibition planning.
 - A new digital membership portal (thanks to Steve Jones) featuring online signups, automated renewals, and digital cards.
- Reaffirmed the transformation agenda and call for deeper member relationships.

6. Fundraising Committee Report

- Background: A special fundraising committee was established following the previous AGM.
- Key initiatives and outcomes:
 - o Immediate Debt Relief:
 - Donations appeal
 - Membership drive
 - BackaBuddy campaign raised R50,000
 - Membership Platform:

Developed in collaboration with Steve Jones; launch post-AGM

Fundraising Events:

Events held during the year raised R34,000

Media Engagement:

Increased press visibility and awareness-building

Proposals and Partnerships:

- R1.4 million grant proposal to the KZN Department (pending)
- Engagement with the UK Foreign, Commonwealth & Development Office

Findings:

- Donor fatigue evident; strategic partnerships now a priority
- Cross-sector collaboration has been a strength

 - Review of business units: Café, Gallery, Shop, etc.
 - Specific funding targets (e.g., roof repairs, playground)
 - Strategy shift from emergency appeals to targeted investment

10. Proposed Changes to the Constitution

- Suggested aligning with SA's NPO governance code and drafting a Board Charter within 30 days.

11. Discussion on Constitution Changes

- supported urgent adoption for governance integrity.
- proposed adoption via by-law structure, not constitutional amendments.
- suggested a 30-day reflection period for members.
- Consensus reached:
 - Adopt proposed changes interim, to be superseded by the forthcoming Board Code of Conduct.
